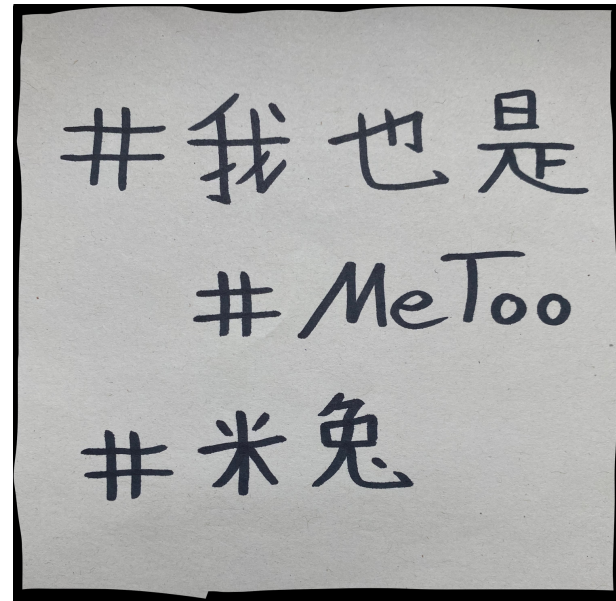


### #MeToo FEMINIST MOVEMENT IN CHINA

Emma, a Chinese feminist activist, has been involved in Chinese feminist movement for ten years. Over the past decade, young women, as an awakened generation, have become the main force of Chinese feminist movement, using creative actions and policy and legal advocacy to raise their voices of resistance. Leveraging the Internet, young women have spread feminist ideas, built alliances, and organized social activities.

However, according to a survey by the World Economic Forum, China ranks 107th in the world in terms of gender equality. In spite of the difficulties and challenges, the feminist movement has shown an unprecedented potential.
